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Special Olympics Illinois Athletes to Compete in State Tennis Tournament

NORMAL, IL. – August 18, 2018 - More than 150 athletes, coaches, and Unified Partners will compete in the Special Olympics Illinois State Tennis Tournament on Saturday, August 18 and Sunday, August 19. The competition is hosted at the Evergreen Racquet Club in Bloomington, Illinois. The State Tennis Tournament is one of nine Special Olympics Illinois State competitions held each year.

State Tennis is the final competition for those participating in tennis, unified tennis, and tennis individual skills. Athletes have the opportunity to compete in short court singles & doubles match play, traditional singles, doubles, and unified doubles match play competitions. Athletes can compete in either match play or individual skills. Competition runs from 8:30 a.m. Saturday, August 18 to 12:30 p.m. on Sunday, August 19.

Outback Steakhouse will generously be providing lunch for all athletes, coaches, Unified Partners, and all-day volunteers on Saturday. The tournament is filled with tough competition and comradery, as well as great sportsmanship.

Special Olympics Illinois will hold an Opening Ceremony as part of the Olympic tradition at 8:00 a.m. at Evergreen Racquet Club. Regions are asked to line up along the sidewalk for the parade of athletes. The Torch Run will also march in for the grand lighting of the cauldron.
