**Tinley Park Truck Convoy to Benefit Local Special Olympics Athletes on October 13**

**Tinley Park, Ill.,** – Law Enforcement and truckers throughout the United States and Canada will join forces to hold the Tinley Park Truck Convoy for Special Olympics hosted by the Tinley Park Police Department. The international fundraising and awareness event is a unique partnership between law enforcement and truckers to raise funds for Special Olympics so the athletes can continue to train in year-round sports activities. Officers involved in the Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics have made the Truck Convoy one of their annual signature events.

Special Olympics Illinois is proud to host the 14th Annual Tinley Park Truck Convoy at the Hollywood Casino Amphitheatre, on Saturday, October 13. Registration starts at 8:00 a.m. beginning at the Hollywood Amphitheatre Casino (19100 Ridgeland Ave.) in Tinley Park, Illinois. The Convoy begins at 10:00 a.m. and Law Enforcement Officers will escort the Convoy approximately 22 miles along I- 57 and I- 80.

Special Olympics athletes and families, the community, companies, and law enforcement agencies will welcome the truckers as they return for lunch and a celebration, complete with awards and raffles. Special Olympics Illinois Global Messenger, Dan Ludemann, will also give a speech to the group.

“Special Olympics has a way of bringing everyone together, setting aside differences and building communities of acceptance,” said Katie Risley, Asst. Director-Torch Run. “The fact that Special Olympics can bring together law enforcement officers and truckers is a testament to how the athletes of Special Olympics are a true inspiration.”

In 2017, a total of 230 trucks participated and raised \$70,000 for the athletes of Special Olympics Illinois. Since 2005, the Illinois Convoy has raised more than \$575,000 with a total of 750 trucks.
