United Center to Host 20th Annual Special Olympics Illinois MedFest on November 5, 2018

CHICAGO, IL. – Special Olympics Illinois is proud to announce that the United Center will host the 20th Annual Special Olympics Illinois MedFest on November 5, 2018, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

MedFest brings more than 1,500 aspiring and current Special Olympics athletes from across the city to the United Center where they receive free sports physicals from over 130 health professionals from Advocate Medical Group. Special Olympics Illinois provides transportation to and from the event for all athletes, bringing them in from a network of Chicago Public Schools, the Chicago Park District, and private institutions.

A sports physical is required for participation in Special Olympics training and competition. The MedFest initiative makes it easier for more children and adults to gain entry to Special Olympics by removing what had been a financial or logistical barrier for many of the participants.

Beyond the free sports physical, MedFest introduces athletes to structured Special Olympics activities for individuals with intellectual disabilities, allowing them to maintain habits for a healthier lifestyle year round and potentially reducing or preventing future health concerns. This event is a model of service that has been adopted worldwide.

MedFest is an opportunity for persons with intellectual disabilities to receive the sports physical required for participation in Special Olympics at no cost. This year will also allow the Special Olympics Illinois athletes to receive a free eye exam through the Opening Eyes program. The Illinois College of Optometry staff will be offering vision screenings to all. If they are in need of glasses, most will receive them that day, or soon afterward. For Free! Lunch is also provided by Levy Restaurants.
