POLICE OFFICERS TEAM UP WITH TEXAS ROADHOUSE TO SUPPORT SPECIAL OLYMPICS ILLINOIS

The 9th Annual Texas Roadhouse Benefit Lunch for Special Olympics Illinois, presented by the Law Enforcement Torch Run, will take place on **Friday, July 26, from 11 a.m. – 2 p.m.**

Participating Texas Roadhouse restaurants will team up with local law enforcement on this exciting event in which law enforcement officers serve the public a “free” lunch of a limited menu during this three-hour time frame.

The Benefit Lunch menu consists of a pulled pork sandwich, corn, fresh-baked bread with honey-cinnamon butter and a non-alcoholic beverage.

Local law enforcement will work alongside Texas Roadhouse staff to serve customers their lunch. Diners are asked to leave a donation for their meal, which is valued at \$9.99. 100% of donations benefit the more than 23,000 athletes with intellectual disabilities and over 17,000 Young Athletes ages 2-7 of Special Olympics Illinois.

Since its inception in 2011, the event has raised more than \$574,000. This year’s goal is \$95,000. Both dine in and carry out will be available at the participating of the Illinois Texas Roadhouse locations.
