TOURNAMENT CENTRAL

Chestnut Mountain Tournament Central will be located on the lower level during competition hours.

- Tuesday Hours: 8:00AM – 3:00PM
- Wednesday Hours: 8:00AM – 4:00PM
- Thursday Hours 8:00AM – 2:00PM (or competition end)
- Tournament Central will be open on the 2nd floor from the end of competition until 7:00pm Tuesday and Wednesday evening.

Eagle Ridge Tournament Central will be located on the lower level in Board Room V.

- Tuesday Hours: 8:00AM – 5:00PM
- Wednesday Hours: 8:00AM – 7:00PM
- Thursday Hours 8:00AM – 2:00PM (or competition end)

REGISTRATION

Agency Registration will take place on Tuesday, January 31, 2023 from 9:00AM – 11:00AM. Agencies will register at their assigned housing location. Only the head coach should report to Registration.

Chestnut Mountain Registration will take place on 2nd floor in Mississippi Room.

Eagle Ridge Registration will take place in back of Foyer.

Stoney Creek and Ramada registration locations will be located near front desk.

TRANSPORTATION

No bus transportation will be provided at the 2023 State Winter Games. All Agencies will need to transport themselves to competition, hotels, meals, and the Opening Ceremony.

ATHLETE COMPETITION BIBS

Each athlete is assigned a number and will receive a competition bib bearing that number.

Competition bibs must be worn during skill assessments, time trials and competition. The label with the name of the athlete goes on the front. After the athlete's competition on Thursday, bibs are returned at the awards venues. Athletes not wearing their bib will not be allowed to compete.

WRISTBANDS FOR ATHLETES

Wristbands must be worn at all times. A wristband for each athlete is provided at registration. The Head Coach is responsible for ensuring that he/she has the proper number of wristbands before leaving the registration area. Bring broken wristbands to Tournament Central for replacement.

DIVISIONING FOR COMPETITION EVENTS

During Winter Games, the snowshoe and alpine event time trials will be used to division athletes for final medal round races. For event management purposes (schedule and weather) some divisions may be grouped into one race but athletes will be awarded based upon their assigned final division. All final race divisions will be posted online. Additionally, to notify you if an athlete has been disqualified from a final race, there will be a disqualification report posted online and sent to each agency SOAD.

Corrections to divisions must be made prior to arrival. No changes to divisions will be made at the competition.

Individual Sports and Individual Skills Divisioning

For individual sports and individual skills competition, divisions will have no more than eight athletes and whenever possible, no less than three. In team sports, the best practice is to have four team divisions to allow for fair and equitable competition.

When possible, athlete divisions have no more than a 20% recorded difference.

At any point in time, genders and age may be combined to allow for competitive divisions. The following universal designations are used:

- M Male
- F Female
- OP Open (eliminates age delineations)
- C Combined (eliminates gender delineations)
- CO Combined Open (eliminates both age and gender delineations)

Disqualification Procedures

Disqualifications will be handled in accordance with Special Olympics Illinois' Disqualification Process:

1. It is the coach's responsibility to be aware of disqualifications at all times. Event officials will be signaled of infractions by the referees. Event officials will not announce disqualifications to the general audience.
2. Disqualified athletes will be given notice of the rule infraction upon completion of the event.
3. A Competition Rules Committee will be available to hear questions concerning disqualified athletes.
4. Awards will be presented upon completion of the event which includes: running of the event; notice of disqualification if necessary; appeal of disqualification if brought forth; and final decision of Competition Rules Committee.
5. Decisions of the Competition Rules Committee will be final and binding.
6. Disqualified athletes will receive a participation ribbon unless the disqualification is for unsportsmanlike conduct, then no award will be presented.
7. No disqualification protest will be heard once awards have been completed.

ATHLETE AWARDS

Chestnut: Awards will be downstairs in the Mississippi Vista Room. Alpine awards will take place immediately after the completion of last event for each level each day.

Eagle Ridge: Awards will be located downstairs in the Galena Room. Snowshoe awards will take place immediately after each final race.

HOUSING FOR ATHLETES AND COACHES

All registered coaches and athletes **are housed at Chestnut Mountain Resort, Eagle Ridge Resort, Stoney Creek Inn or the Ramada of Galena.**

Check-In: Once you have registered, you may be allowed to check into your rooms. Some rooms may not be available until 3:00pm, the normal check-in time. There are a limited number of keys available for each room, and they are given to coaches. **Room keys are the responsibility of the coaches.**

Check-Out: All rooms must be vacated by 11:00am Thursday. Return keys to the front desk of your assigned hotel. Please pack and load vehicles before competition begins. At Chestnut, the

Mississippi Room may be used for luggage storage on Thursday. At Eagle Ridge, please use the Galena Room.

MEALS FOR ATHLETES AND COACHES

Meals will be provided for registered coaches and athletes. Meal locations will be assigned based on housing. If an athlete requires a special diet, it is the responsibility of the coach to provide for the athlete's needs.

All lunches will be a boxed cold lunch:

- All agencies will pick up lunch in dining room upstairs at Chestnut or outside the Eagle Ridge Ballroom.
- Lunches will be pre boxed by agency. All lunches for an agency will need to be picked up at the same time.

Athletes and coaches will eat breakfast at their assigned hotel. Menus may vary.

Athletes and coaches assigned to the Ramada or Stoney Creek will be required to dinner eat at Eagle Ridge on Wednesday evening. Athletes and coaches assigned to Chestnut will eat dinner in the Chestnut Mountain Dining Room.

All agencies will eat Tuesday's dinner at assigned location in downtown Galena or at Chestnut Mountain Resort. Please check your agency's registration packet for restaurant assignments.

Agencies must inform Special Olympics Illinois by the scratch deadline if they are not eating downtown on Tuesday evening.

OPENING CEREMONY

The Opening Ceremony and the Parade of Athletes is in downtown Galena On Tuesday, January 31st beginning at 5:30pm. Line-up begins at 5:15pm on Green Street near the historic Post Office building. Agencies will line up behind their Region flag. The parade progresses through the downtown area and back to the Post Office where the Opening Ceremony is held. Please check your agency registration packet for more detailed Opening Ceremony and dinner information.

THE OPENING CEREMONY WILL TAKE PLACE OUTSIDE; PLEASE DRESS APPROPRIATELY.

EVENING ENTERTAINMENT

Swimming

Due to housing assignment changes, lifeguards will not be provided by Special Olympics Illinois. If an agency wants to allow swimming then the agency is required to provide their own lifeguard and swimming will be at the agency's own risk. According to the Special Olympics Policies and Procedures, "All Special Olympics swimming training, competition, and recreational sessions will be conducted in accordance with basic safety practices as specified in the swimming section in the Special Olympics Sports Rules Book. Briefly, this policy specifies that in all swimming activities, there must be a certified lifeguard on duty while athletes are in the water. This policy is in place for training and competition as well as recreational swimming activities at the hotel pool. Proof of certification must be produced upon request. Violation of this policy could result in disciplinary action."

NOTE: American Red Cross Water Safety Instructor's Certification does not authorize one as a certified lifeguard.

Victory Dance

Special Olympics Illinois will offer a dance on Wednesday, February 1, 2023 from 7pm – 8:30pm. 2 dance locations will be offered: Chestnut Mountain and Eagle Ridge Resort Ball Room.

DAYTIME ACTIVITIES

Alpine Skiing

Chestnut Mountain Ski Shop is offering reduced prices to Special Olympics athletes and their coaches for equipment and lift tickets if they would like to participate in recreational skiing. Athletes registered for alpine events will receive equipment rental and lift tickets if needed at no cost.

Healthy Habits

Healthy Habits are interactive education stations that help build awareness of how healthy habits affect sport performance and everyday life. Athletes, partners, coaches, family members, volunteers and staff will learn how to improve performance the day of competition and in the future. We will be offering two Healthy Habit topics: Goal Setting and Nutrition. Healthy Habits will be offered on Tuesday 9am-3:30pm and Wednesday 9:30am-3:30pm. The stations will be located Eagle Ridge Lower Level.

Electric Kiosk

The Special Olympics Illinois kiosk is located in the lower level of Eagle Ridge Resort and lower level of Chestnut Mountain. Please utilize the kiosk to check competition schedules, results, venue and event support locations, Special Olympics Illinois information and to find out entertainment and dining options in the community.

Immersive Technology

Available at Winter Games this year is the Immersive Technology room in the Eagle Ridge Ballroom. Tuesday thru Thursday of Winter Games, athletes will have the opportunity to interact with the immersive technology room, which offers eSports game systems, interactive touch boards, augmented reality headsets, photobooths and more! We invite athletes, coaches and families to experience how technology can be used in our everyday lives, and to accentuate our sports training and competition.
